Kallos Gallery and its founder Baron Lorne Thyssen-Bornemisza have been long-time supporters of Classics for All, and are thrilled to be working with the charity and Roseberys London. Since the opening of Kallos in 2014 the gallery has held annual events in support of CFA and their work to promote the teaching of Classics in state schools across the UK.

Due to the ongoing pandemic we have been unable to host such events in the gallery this year. Therefore, we are pleased to present this Christmas auction to show our continued support and to highlight their work to a wider audience.

The charity auction will offer an array of exciting Christmas gifts including ancient works of art, jewellery, and unique experiences offered by patrons of CFA.

The charity Classics for All has been putting classical subjects on the map in state schools for the past ten years, with great success. Despite many challenges including the pandemic, it has reached over 920 schools, trained 3,000 teachers and engaged over 60,000 pupils.
With no government support, the charity raises funds to meet rising demand from primary and secondary schools keen to introduce Latin, ancient history, classical civilisation and Ancient Greek.





Rieu's translation of the *Iliad* was published four years after his *Odyssey*; both were cornerstones of his renowned Penguin Classics series. Including 5 full-page maps, this limited edition is a thorough revision that take into account much recent scholarship. With his new introduction, Dr Peter Jones adds important critical insight.



Tignanello wine needs little introduction. We offer a single lot of three magnums of the 2016 vintage from Geoffrey de Jager's (former chairman of Classics For All) renowned wine cellar.

This Tignanello shows an intense and bright ruby red colour. On the nose, notes of ripe red fruits come together with pleasant hints of fresh blackberry and wild berries, with delicate and perfectly integrated aromas of vanilla and dark chocolate with light spice sensations. On the palate, the wine is vibrant, with silky and refined tannins. Balanced and intense, it has a long, complex and persistent finish. Tignanello is bottled only in favourable vintages, and the experts rate this one 97/100 Wine Spectator (USA), Wine Advocate (USA) and James Suckling (USA) and 98/100 Galloni (IT). Some say this is one of the best Tignanello ever produced.




40 | TICKETS TO SEE A RECORDING OF *HAVE I GOT News for you*
